



The FBI's Next Generation Identification (NGI) Rap Back Program and Mandatory Fingerprint Enrollment for SAIC Cleared Personnel

The Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency (DCSA) is enhancing its vetting process for Defense Industrial Base (DIB) personnel by enrolling all individuals with security clearance eligibility in the FBI's **Next Generation Identification (NGI) Rap Back Program**. SAIC is committed to supporting this initiative as part of its compliance with federal requirements for maintaining personnel security clearances.

The NGI Rap Back Program provides **real-time notifications** to DCSA of any changes to an enrolled individual's criminal or civil records by leveraging continuous fingerprint checks.

As part of this process, SAIC personnel with security clearance eligibility have already granted permission for fingerprint-based criminal history checks during the initial clearance application process

What You Need to Know

- **Mandatory Requirement:** Enrollment in Rap Back is mandatory for all personnel with security clearance eligibility. SAIC aims to complete all enrollments by the end of 2027 to meet DCSA and FBI requirements.
- **Continuous Vetting Enhancements:** Your fingerprints will be used to conduct ongoing checks against new criminal or civil activity records submitted to the FBI. This process improves security, reduces the need for periodic reinvestigations, and helps prevent potential security risks.
- **Re-Fingerprinting Process:** If your fingerprints on file are deemed unclassifiable or incompatible with the NGI Rap Back system, you will be contacted by **SAIC Security** or the **Enterprise Security Shared Services (ESSS)** team with instructions for providing updated fingerprints.
- **Compliance Reminder:** Personnel are required to cooperate in updating fingerprints when needed. Failure to provide updated fingerprints may directly affect your eligibility for access to classified information.
